New Books for Edgars Creek Primary School

On Friday the 3rd of November Author and Illustrator Gabrielle Wang visited Edgars Creek Primary School. Below is the article printed in our local paper The NC Review.

Students at Edgar's Creek Primary School at Wollert were last week treated to a visit from Australian author Gabrielle Wang as part of a grant from the Australian Children's Laureate Foundation, ACLF.

The ACLF provided a grant of \$10,000 to the school, which will be used to buy culturallydiverse books for the school's library as well as hosting Ms Wang for a series of interactive workshops.

Ms Wang, a children's author and illustrator from Melbourne, is the current Australian Children's laureate and has been travelling to numerous schools across Australia to host workshops to promote her chosen theme of 'Imagine a Story'.

The Laureate is appointed on a biennial basis and serves to promote the transformative power of reading, creativity and storytelling in young peoples' lives.

"I love it. It's a joy to know that your books have been borrowed from the libraries," Ms Wang said.

"The more kids that read, the better, and as an author, that's what you write for. First of all, you write for yourself, but then you write for the children."

Ms Wang is the ACLF's seventh laureate and her time in the role has included opening two libraries at new schools, all while promoting her ideas of imagination in storytelling.

Through two sessions at Edgars Creek Primary School, students were encouraged to share their sources of inspiration and were shown how to draw a character from one of Ms Wang's stories.

"The kids were fantastic, especially when I asked them where they get ideas for stories from. Their responses were exceptional," she said.

"Sometimes it's just the ordinary 'from your head' or 'from stories', but the kids' answers were really so diverse, and I was very, very impressed.

"I just think it's fantastic that we have the opportunity to host this sort of event, and it's really good to promote the [ACLF] to promote reading and the love of reading."

Assistant principal Matthew Dunstone said the school was thankful to have received the grant to support students' reading.

"As a new school, we're always looking at building our resources to support our learning programs and to receive a grant like this supports us no end," he said.

"It's a great opportunity for the students to hear from a professional author and it broadens their horizons so they have access to different kinds of resources, different inspirations for their own writing and reading."

The school also hosted guests from Lendlease, Bendigo Bank and the ACLF on Friday to officially present the new books.

CSEF 2024

2024 CSEF applications are now open. We encourage all families to read the attached information regarding their eligibility for additional funding under the Camps, Sports and Excursion Fund (CSEF). Camps, Sports and Excursions fund eligibility

Below are the criteria used to determine a student's eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF).

Criteria 1 - Eligibility

To be eligible* for the fund, a mature minor of sixteen years of age or over, a parent or legal guardian of a student attending a registered Government or non-government Victorian primary or secondary school must:

- · on the first day of Term one, or;
- · on the first day of Term two.
- a) Be an eligible beneficiary within the meaning of the State Concessions Act 2004, that is, be a holder of Veterans
 Affairs Gold Card or be an eligible Centrelink Health Care Card (HCC) or Pensioner Concession Card (PCC)
 holder, OR
- b) Be a temporary foster parent, and;
- c) Submit an application to the school by the due date.
- * A special consideration eligibility category also exists. For more information, see: <u>Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF)</u>: <u>Eligibility | education.vic.gov.au</u>

Mature minors or parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with one of (a) or (b) above.

Criteria 2 - Be of school age and attend school in Victoria

School is compulsory for all Victorian children aged between six and seventeen years of age inclusive.

For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a Victorian registered primary or secondary school. Typically, these students are aged between five and eighteen years inclusive.

CSEF is not payable to students attending pre-school, kindergarten, home schooling, or TAFE.

Eligibility Date

For concession card holders, CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/legal guardian's concession card being successfully validated with Centrelink on 29 January 2024 and/or 15 April 2024.

Payment amounts

CSEF payment amount

The CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of the eligible student.

- Primary school student rate: \$150.00 per year.
- · Secondary school student rate: \$250.00 per year.

The CSEF is paid directly the school and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child.

For ungraded students, the rate payable is determined by the student's date of birth. For more information, see: Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF): Payment amounts | education.vic.gov.au

Foundation and Year 7 government school students who are CSEF recipients are also eligible for a uniform voucher. Schools are required to make applications on behalf of parents, so please register your interest at the school.

How to complete the application form

NOTE: ALL SECTIONS MUST BE COMPLETED BY PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN

Complete the PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN DETAILS section.
 Make sure that the Surname, First Name, and Customer Reference Number (CRN) details match those on your

concession card. You will also need to provide your concession card to the school.

- If you are claiming as a Foster Parent or a Veteran Affairs Pensioner, you will need to provide a copy of documentation confirming your status as a temporary Foster Parent or provide your Veterans Affairs Pensioner Gold card to the school.
- 2. Complete the STUDENT/S DETAILS section for students at this school.
- Sign and date the form and return it to the school office as soon as possible. The CSEF program for 2024 closes at the end of term two 2024.

CSEF payments cannot be claimed retrospectively for prior years.

Queries relating to CSEF eligibility and payments should be directed to the school.







Enrolment and Bookings

Permanent Bookings:

For children who use the service on a weekly basis, permanent bookings are considered to be at least one session per week for an entire term or more.

Casual Bookings:

A casual booking is a one-off booking that occurs occasionally and is not part of the permanent booking schedule for that child.

Casual bookings can be made by contacting your centre managervia phone call, text message or email.

Cancellations:

Bookings can be cancelled up to 48 hours prior to the session without incurring a session fee. For cancellations within 48 hours of the session, you will be charged the full fee, less any Child Care Subsidy you are entitled to, unless you are able to provide a medical certificate.

Payment:

How to pay:

Payments can be made by Direct Debitvia our third-party provider, Quick Pay.

When will I be charged?

For Direct Debit payments, families are charged weekly in arrears. Statements will be emailed on Fridays to your email address registered in your XAP account. Your bank account will be automatically debited with the amount you owe each Monday.

Payment Processing:

Big Childcare invoice in arrears from the bank account nominated by the family using Quick Pay.

Statements are sent on a weekly basis prior to direct debit the following week. EFTPOS Payments can be arranged with your centre manager.


