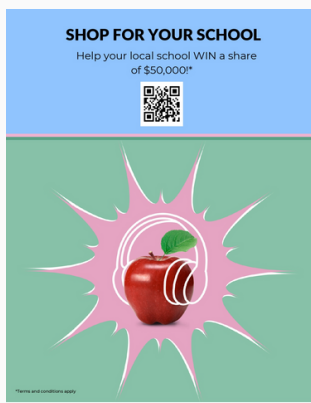

Senior educators from the Department of Education North-Western Region will be joining us for lunch to meet our distinguished guests and view some of the teaching and learning at Edgars Creek Primary School.

Our ECPS school community is invited to a special assembly to welcome our guests on Tuesday 14th May between 9.10am and 10.00am in the school gym.

Dr Santosh (Ann's partner Principal) will be at ECPS for the Wednesday morning also.

Dr Santosh Vyas

Principal, Sadhu Vaswani International School for Girls in Delhi India.



Santosh leads a school of nearly 2000 female students from Kinder to Year 12. She has a M.A in Political Science, M. Phil from University of Delhi, B.Ed from Central Institute of Education, University of Delhi and Ph.D. Her educational and administrative experience helps her to understand the dynamism of the ever changing educational requirements.

Santosh and her staff hosted Ann as part of the Victorian Principal's Indian immersion program. Ann spent 3 days at the school viewing classroom learning, looking at the teaching and learning programs, their wellbeing programs and talking with students and staff.

Santosh is looking forward to visiting ECPS and watching many aspects of our educational programs she discussed with Ann while she was visiting.

Mallika Preman

Principal, Tagore International School, New Delhi, India

Mallika is the Principal of this school in New Delhi of 2400 students and 120 staff. She is a passionate educator with experience of 30 years working in niche schools in India.

Mallika believes in the Gandhian proverb "Be the change that you want to see" and uses her vast experience to inspire others.



Donna Wright

Principal, Bandiana Primary School (near Wodonga)

Donna leads a rural school of 281 students and 21 teachers. She is committed to inclusive education and has presented lectures at a national and international level. Donna was named Australian Principal of the Year of Government and Independent Schools 2020 and Victorian Marrung Leader 2023.

Students not selected in a team will play in the house intra-school competition at school.

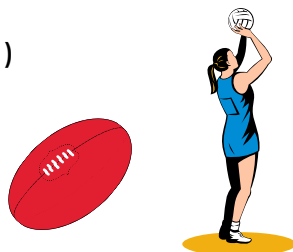
ECPS home games will be played at the school. AFL for this week will be played at Epping reserve. Students require a mouthguard to play AFL.

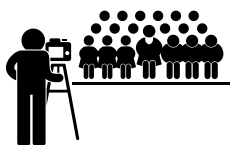

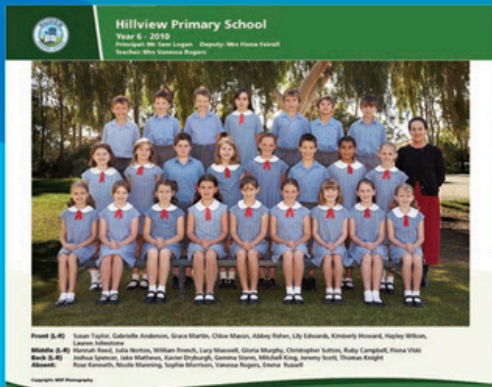

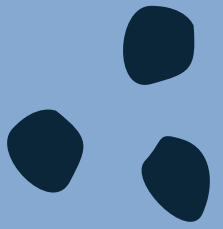
